BOX 2 - RULES & CONDITIONS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Permit holders must possess a valid trapping license. ● Trapping dates and rules will vary by area and season: <p style="margin-left: 20px;">Zone 1: Permit for Regular Trapping Season</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">Zone 2: For Village of Belleville - Special Animal Control (Fee Waived)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Non-trapping park users have the right to use the entire park and off-trails. Trappers must use care and be safety-conscious at all times. ● These trails are open for dog walking. Dog owners are required to have their dogs on leashes at all times and clean up after them. If you become aware of an issue related to off-leash dogs, please report it to 608-424-3129. ● Permit Rules and Regulations - All Wisconsin General Trapping Regulations apply with the following and more restrictive permit rules listed below. In general trapping is limited to live trapping on land and lethal trapping below the waterline. These specific rules are in place to minimize the change of trapping non-targeted species. The permit will allow for the trapping of the following animals in each category: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Raccoon, Skunk and Opossum <input type="checkbox"/> Muskrat and Mink <input type="checkbox"/> Beaver <input type="checkbox"/> Coyote and Fox ● This permit includes a property map that identifies the zone boundary and the area where trapping can potentially take place. Traps must be setback at least 30 yards from any maintained mowed service area, trails, buildings or access areas. Traps should not be visible from these areas. Trap locations shall be identified with colored stakes or flagging. All traps (land and water) must be checked daily. ● Incidental Animals - If non-target animals are incidentally trapped they are to be released, yet included in the Dane County Trapper Report. A pole release system must be used to release all non-targeted animals. ● Harvest - A .22 caliber or other smaller firearm including air guns, as allowed by State law, may be used to harvest game under this permit. Harvested animals will be placed into opaque container or bag for transport.

- **Wildlife Disease Issues** - Be aware of and report any diseases issues that you may become aware of. Disease issues in wildlife populations generally occur or are found when a populations builds to high concentrations. Diseases present in Wisconsin wild animal populations that may impact domestic animals and/or humans include: Rabies, Tularemia, canine and Feline Distemper Virus, Sarcoptic Mange, Canine Parvovirus, and Raccoon Roundworm.

Raccoon, Skunk and Opossum

Permit season: First Monday in November through February 15th
 Approved land traps: Enclosed Trigger Traps and Cage Traps (Ex. Egg Trap, Lil' Griz & Duffer Trap)

Muskrat and Mink

Permit Season Start: First Monday in November through February 15th
 Approved traps: Body grip traps of the 110 and 120 size or No. 1 ½ or smaller foot hold traps.
 No trapping within three feet of shore on any creek or drainage
 Traps must be totally submerged under water at all times.

Beaver

Permit Season Start: First Monday in January through February 15th
 Otter are to be avoided and all body grip traps of the 220 and 330 sizes must be set with otter avoidance techniques that include offset triggers. Avoidance techniques:

 Approved traps: Body grip traps of the 220 size set at least 15' from shore or placed under 2-inches of ice and/or body grip traps of the 330 size placed below 2-inches of ice at least 15' shore and at least 2-feet below the water surface
 Underwater cable restraint-only when placed under ice (Otter avoidance trap).

Coyote and Fox

Permit Season Start: First Monday in January through February 15th
 Approved trap: The Wisconsin Cable Restraint
